Covid 19 Omicron Variant- Guidance for Churches:

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have made the following recommendations in the wake of Covid 19 Omicron Variant:

- Anyone displaying any symptoms of Covid 19 should stay at home and not travel to church or participate in person.
- Hand sanitizer provided in Church should be used when entering and leaving the Church building.
- That the practice of wearing face coverings (both covering nose and mouth) during the act of worship should be strictly adhered to unless exempted
- To ensure good ventilation/air saturation in the Church building. Given the current climatic conditions, this might imply wrapping up well when coming to church.
- That those engaged in any pastoral ministry which involves visiting the sick and housebound should take regular lateral flow tests to ensure it is safe to do so.
- That those who have not yet been vaccinated or received the booster jab should be encouraged to do so, when able.
