### Reflection

The Gospel reading this Sunday is taken from the opening paragraphs of Jesus sermon on the mount. It consists of what are known as the Beatitudes. They are not always easy to understand because they run counter to generally accepted views. It is worth pausing to reflect on what Jesus words mean.

So Jesus says, '*Blessed are the poor in spirit*', those who put their trust in God rather than money; and those who admit that it is not their income, possessions or bank account that makes them rich in the eyes of God, but what kind of people they are.

Jesus says, '*Blessed are those who mourn*', those who let themselves feel the misfortune, pain and sorrow of others, and who respond to them with understanding, sympathy, kindness, compassion, and practical assistance.

Jesus says, '*Blessed are the meek*', because meekness is not weakness, but a form of strength.

Jesus says, '*Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness*'. The only power and status we really need is to keep living in God's way and to keep doing the right thing. Satisfaction and contentment will be found in living with a good conscience.

Jesus says, '*Blessed are the merciful*', those who make allowances for the faults and sins of others, and whose compassion lies in their ability to forgive. They will receive mercy and forgiveness from God for their own sins.

Jesus says, '*Blessed are the pure in heart*'. It is from the heart that all our thoughts, words, and actions flow. If the heart is pure, then everything that flows from it will be pure.

Jesus says, '*Blessed are the peacemakers*', those who spread understanding among people, those who welcome strangers, and those who work for a more just and equal society. They are, Jesus adds, the children of God.

Jesus says, '*Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness sake*'. They may suffer for their stand but their sufferings are marks of honour and integrity.

In the Beatitudes then, Jesus gives us challenging advice on how to be good Christians and about the qualities he hopes to see in us, his followers.
