### Reflection

The Gospel reading for this Sunday is taken from the Prologue to St John's Gospel, its first 18 verses. It is not an easy passage to fully understand but in essence it summarises and encapsulates the whole Gospel message. It serves as a profound theological introduction, establishing Jesus' divine identity and pivotal role in God's plan for creation and redemption.

The very first words, "In the beginning", are the same as the first words in the book of Genesis at the start of the Old Testament. John uses them to emphasise that God always existed and was eternally present in what he said and did. Everything was made through Him, and nothing exists apart from Him.

God the Father, or the word of God as St John puts it, created all things, made a covenant with his people, spoke to them through the prophets, provided the Law by which people should live and acted to intervene in human history.

And then God's plan in creation and his plan of salvation reach their fulfilment in the person of Jesus Christ who comes into the world as man to dwell amongst us and to give light and life to humankind. The Word became human at Christmas and lived among us, revealing God's glory and fullness of grace and truth. This Light of Jesus shines into the world, and the darkness cannot overcome it because Jesus' presence overcomes evil.

It is Jesus who gives life. His word purifies those who receive it, judges those who reject it and brings eternal life. While the world and His own people didn't recognize or receive Him, those who did were given the right to become children of God, born not of human descent but of God. Jesus makes the invisible God known to humanity; no one has seen God, but Jesus has revealed Him.

The Prologue reaches its climax in the sentence which reads: "From his fullness, we have all of us received grace upon grace". The graces of the Old Covenant are built upon by the graces of Jesus' New Covenant. Jesus brings a new era of God's grace and truth, surpassing the Law given through Moses.

Jesus' coming to us enables us to partake in divine fullness by becoming children of God. Through the gift of God's grace we can each hold out the hope of eternal salvation.
