Reflection

Today we mark the occasion of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord which also marks the last day of the entire Christmas season in our liturgical calendar and year.

In the gospel, Jesus steps out of the hidden years of Nazareth and into the waters of the Jordan. He does not need repentance, yet he chooses to stand where sinners stand. In doing so, he reveals the heart of God, a God who does not remain distant, but enters fully into our human story.

The readings draw our attention to identity. In the first reading, the Servant of the Lord is presented as one chosen, upheld, and delighting the heart of God. This servant brings justice not by force, but by gentleness. The Gospel reveals this servant clearly. As Jesus is baptised, the heavens open, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the voice of the Father is heard, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Before Jesus performs a miracle, preaches a sermon, or gathers disciples, he is affirmed in love. His mission flows from this relationship, not the other way around.

This moment at the Jordan also speaks directly to us. Our baptism is not simply a ritual from the past or a family celebration captured in photographs. It is the foundation of who we are. In baptism, the same words are spoken over us in a quieter way, you are my beloved child. We are claimed by God before we achieve anything, before we prove ourselves worthy, before we succeed or fail.

The challenge of this feast is to live from our baptismal identity. Many of us spend our lives trying to earn value, approval, or security through status, possessions, or recognition. The Baptism of the Lord calls us back to a deeper truth. We are already loved. From that love flows our call to live differently, to stand with the vulnerable, to act justly, to forgive generously, and to resist the temptation to define ourselves by anything other than God's love.

As we begin Ordinary Time, the waters of the Jordan invite us to remember our own baptism. They ask us to step again into the grace already given, and to allow God to say once more, not only to Jesus but to each of us, "You are my beloved." Living that truth may be the most demanding, and the most freeing, task of all.
