Reflection

THREE CHRISTMAS COMPONENTS: JOY, PRAYER, AND GRATITUDE

The third Sunday of Advent is known as "Gaudete Sunday". We celebrate the peace, hope, and joy Christ brought into the world at His birth. "Rejoice in the Lord always; I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near": this is the invitation of this Sunday from the Entrance Antiphon (Philippians 4:4-5).

God's loving care for His children is a cause for rejoicing. With Christmas just a few days away, the liturgy of Gaudete Sunday invites Christians to joy. That is to say, always remain in joy, even when things do not go according to our desires. The joy of the Christian comes from faith and the encounter with Jesus Christ, the source of true joy. The more we are rooted in Christ, the more we find inner serenity, even in the midst of everyday contradictions like John the Baptist in today's

Pope Francis said that the Christian who has met Jesus cannot be "a prophet of misfortune" but must be "a witness and a herald of joy". This is "a joy to share with others; a contagious joy that makes life's journey less tiring." Share this heavenly joy this Christmas. As children of God, we can never be tired of singing the glory of the Lord at Christmas because our Creator has become man, born of the Virgin. We have been made sharers in the divinity of Christ who humbled Himself to share our humanity (Catechism of the Catholic Church,

Indeed, there may be times in our lives when our faith is weakening, our hope is fading, and our charity is waning – turn again to Christ. And also, be encouraged by the words of Prophet Isaiah in today's Communion Antiphon: "Say to the faint of heart: Be strong and do not fear. Behold, our God will come, and He will save us."
