### Reflection

The Church celebrates the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time as the Sunday of the Word of God, a day set aside to renew our love for Sacred Scripture and to place God's word at the heart of Christian life. Pope Francis established this celebration in 2019. On this day, we are reminded that the Bible is not merely a book from the past but God's living voice, speaking to us today.

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah speaks to a people who have known darkness, fear, and uncertainty. Into that darkness, God's Word announces hope, light, and joy. This is not a distant promise but a living assurance that God does not abandon his people. The Word reveals God as one who enters human history to restore dignity and guide his people forward.

The Gospel shows the fulfilment of this promise in Jesus. He begins his ministry by proclaiming a simple but demanding message, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand." His Word is immediately followed by action as he calls ordinary people to follow him. The fishermen respond not because they fully understand, but because the Word spoken to them carries authority and life. God's Word calls, and those who listen are changed.

The Sunday of the Word of God invites each of us to reflect on how we receive Scripture. Do we allow God's Word to challenge our habits and comfort our fears? Do we make space for it in our homes, our prayer, and our decisions? Scripture is not meant only to be heard at Mass but to be lived daily, guiding us as disciples of Christ.

When welcomed, the Word of God brings light in darkness, unity in division, and direction in daily life.
